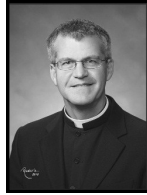

What are our Alumni doing?

Pauletta Lehn, Class of 1995

I recently moved to Zurich, Switzerland with my family. We now live in a city nestled between mountains and situated around a lake so clean you can drink the water. I have learned that beyond a passion for cheese and chocolate, the Swiss love to keep schedule and mind the rules. I have also learned that the crime rate is among the lowest in the world for metropolitan areas, and routinely see rows of unlocked bicycles and unattended purses and bags. I guess I didn't need to pack my "Forgetaboutit" bike lock from our Brooklyn days!

There are many changes I'm getting used to. I moved here knowing the country loves outdoor winter sports so we brought a sled in order to participate in a more casual (and safer) winter sport, only to find that they have 10k sled runs with lifts to get to the top and people actually die sledding here. So why the land of neutrality and risky winter sports? My husband, Matt, is an actuary and he had an opportunity to have his dream job at an international level, so we packed up for the adventure.

It's an adventure all right, along with many challenges that come with living internationally. The reality is that this girl from the prairie now lives in the Alps, and sometimes struggles with who I am here. After all if you start telling Europeans that you have Polish or German heritage, they start speaking to you in Polish or German. It's hard to encapsulate oneself in an introduction when you're so far removed from home. "No, actually it was great grandparents who immigrated to the United States and settled in Nebraska. Do you know where Nebraska is... I took Spanish in high school..."

Although I have traveled abroad many times before, it's a whole different experience when you stay for awhile, try to acclimate to a specific community, and really put yourself out there culturally and linguistically by trying to participate on a long-term basis.

I'm certain our 3-yr-old daughter will learn German and Swiss-German quickly, and soon enough I'll be the immigrant parent asking her to translate signs for me in the grocery store. It's a very humbling experience.

It takes me back to the question of identity. I can't work here yet. I can't be involved in the various ministries I love yet and when I can, it'll be very different. I can't employ my mastery of any language or my personality because of it. It's still the Western world, to be sure, but it's 4,700 miles away from "my people" – the individuals and communities that have shaped who I am at my core.

So, if "your people" aren't around you and you aren't defined by what you know or what you do, how do you define yourself?

For me, the answer is deeply spiritual. As I remember who I am from previous experiences, I reimagine what that means in this context. The voices, the relationships, the teachings, the faith in action, the laughter and the tears, and textures from before give confidence for redefining myself for the present. I have to trust that the Spirit is involved.

My foundational communities, like St. Patrick's Parish and Bergan, contributed to the formation of my character and sense of self at a critical time for me. I was a transplant my senior year to Bergan since my high school in Omaha closed. I came in disillusioned and was restored by the community. I had a holy, healing experience that I can't help but recall during times of significant transition. Aunt Kitty & Uncle Tom Micek lovingly took me into their home on Garden City Road, while cousin T.J. welcomed me to his close-knit community of friends in the senior class and beyond, some of whom had been together since kindergarten.

I had a crash course in Bergan Knights traditions. I knew that studying Macbeth with Mrs. Mueller was like a rite of passage. I knew learning in Mr. Wojtkiewicz's classroom was also a lesson in artful pedagogy. Legends like Gary Schmidt took the time to make sure my transition was smooth. These are just a few examples of how I knew right away that I was jumping into something special.

I was astonished by the green and gold welcome and had an unbelievable senior year because I was allowed to share in the faith, tradition, and joy already present there. I couldn't be more grateful. I was the recipient of gracious hospitality I could have only dreamed of.

I found out on St. Patrick's Day of my former school's closing the spring before attending Bergan, and I remember saying the Serenity Prayer that day. That prayer was a touchstone prayer at Bergan while I was there, and there was sweet comfort in saying it with new friends facing their own challenges. Everyone had his or her different experiences but we were there creating something new together. Funny enough, Shamrock, the English-speaking Irish

Pub, a few blocks away in our Zurich neighborhood, has the Serenity Prayer posted on the wall. I cannot help but smile and take it as a sign of assurance and grace.

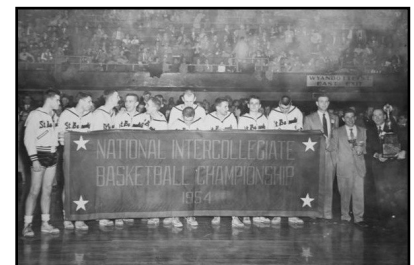
*God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change,

On October 29, 2011, the class of 1954 St. Benedict's College men's basketball team was inducted into the Raven Athletic Hall of Fame. The team won the 1954 NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) National Championship in Kansas City. Clinton "Buddy" Lord (51) was part of this team while receiving his college education at St. Benedicts College, now named Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas.

The St. Patrick's High School class of 1951 was the charter class. Clinton "Buddy" was known for his musical ability and performances in the St. Patrick's male quartette and the spring operetta "Sunbonnet Sue." He played one of the lead roles in the senior class play as well as demonstrating his sports abilities on the basketball court.

James Korth ('69) Recognized for his work with Veterans

Jim is the son of Bob and Norma Korth. He attended Chadron State College and served in the US Navy. He and his family reside in Bozeman, Montana. This information was submitted by Norma Korth.

The governor's office of Community Service recognized Jim Korth, Veteran Service Provider as the "Volunteer of the Game" during a recent Montana State University Bobcats' game.

"Korth's commitment to helping veterans in need is extraordinary," said Governor Brian Schweitzer. "Montana has a long tradition of neighbors helping neighbors. Those who volunteer are truly unsung heroes and it is their hard work and dedication that helps make our state great."

Jim Korth works with the Disabled Veterans Outreach Program, but his commitment to serving veterans in the community extends well beyond his day job. Last summer, Korth helped coordinate the second annual "Veteran Stand down" that reached out to local veterans and families. During the "Stand Down," over 300 veterans received free services including haircuts, medical screenings, and employment assistances provided by 200 volunteers. Korth has also been instrumental in organizing the monthly Veterans Service Provider Meetings in Bozeman. These meetings bring together all the different agencies that support veterans.

"Whenever there is a need for a volunteer, Jim Korth is the go-to guy," said Brenda York, Montana State University Director of

Disability, Re-Entry and Veterans Services. "He is always there for the Bozeman community."

Korth served in the United States Navy and is an active member of the Vietnam Veterans of America and the American Legion in Bozeman. He believes that it is important to give back to his community and to support those who are still serving in the military.

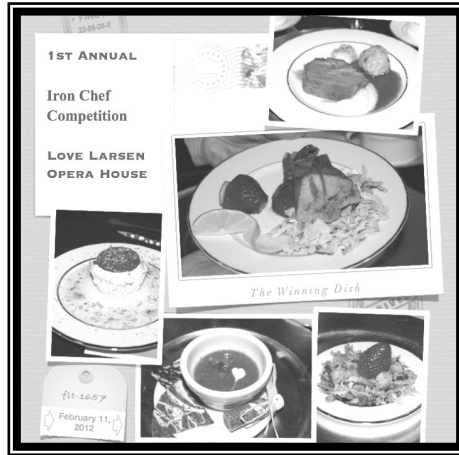
