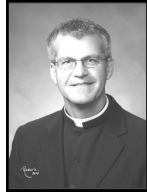

Principal's News



At Archbishop Bergan Catholic School, extra-curricular activities are the other half of the educational process. Whether it is fine arts, athletics or clubs and organizations, students learn extremely valuable lessons through extra-curricular participation. We encourage our students to participate in a number of activities that not only help each student reach their full potential, but also help our school achieve at the highest levels. Research has proven that students involved in extra-curricular activities have a higher grade point average and a greater connection to the school as well.

As a Bergan Knight, the expectation has always been to give everything that you have got in the classroom. This expectation also extends to extra-curricular activities. There exists such a sense of tradition, pride and respect for

these activities and the lessons that are taught through extra-curricular participation.

Archbishop Bergan Catholic School offers a number of fine arts opportunities for students to experience. Through participation in activities such as band, choir, speech team and drama, students have the ability to explore their talents and share them with the community. This past year we have had a number of triumphs in the arts. Our band and choir performances have achieved superior ratings at recent district music contests. Our speech team produced a district finalist this past year as well. Our One Act play production "Freak" was the district champion and qualified for the Nebraska State Championships. This past spring our students performed "High School Musical." If one was lucky enough to attend the sold out performances, they had the ability to see all of the talented students that attend Archbishop

Bergan Catholic School.

The Bergan Knights also had another solid campaign in athletics this past school year. The boys' and girls' cross country teams were young, but made a lot of progress throughout the season by improving their times each and every meet. The girls' volleyball team finished as the district runner up and was one game away from qualifying for the state tournament. The football team was also the district runner up and advanced all the way to the Nebraska State playoff quarterfinals. The girls' basketball team rounded out their season with a runner up finish in the sub-district, doubling their win total from last season to this season. The wrestling team was district runner up for the first time in thirty years this season producing four individual district champions. 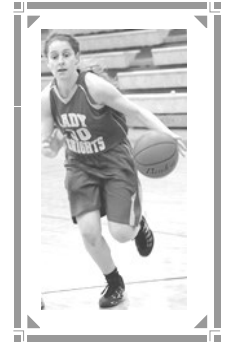

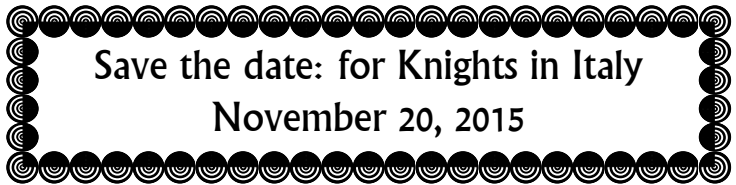
