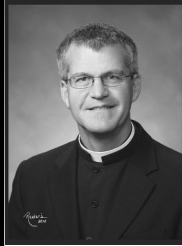

Our students not only are gaining excellent skills in the areas of language arts, math, science, and social studies, but have the opportunity to experience foreign language, physical education, instrumental music, vocal music, computer applications, and visual arts.

Additionally our students receive daily theology lessons based on the teachings of the Catholic Church. During the winter months our students also experience the development of important life skills through our extracurricular activity offerings. There are important life lessons that are practiced through participation in school sponsored athletics, clubs and organizations. As you can see knowledge is central to every aspect of our school.

Service towards others is a foundation of who we are at Archbishop Bergan. Throughout the years, the members of the Bergan family have been called upon to support one of our family members due to an illness, fire, loss of life, etc. We at school regularly then "circle the wagons" and create a system of support for these families. COMMUNITY

Fremont, Nebraska is a college town of 26,000 people. It is located in Dodge County, 20 miles northwest of Omaha. Fremont hosts a 100-bed hospital, Midland University and a Metropolitan Community College campus. Income is derived primarily from agriculture related industry.

POST GRADUATION PLANS

A ten year average of graduates surveyed states that 78% were planning on attending a four year university and 20% attending a two year college. 98% of graduates continue education after high school.

NATIONAL TESTING

Since 2005, 94% of the students at Archbishop Bergan took the ACT. During that time period the state of Nebraska averaged 75% of students taking the ACT. The 8 year ACT average score for Archbishop Bergan students was a score of 22.6. The Nebraska average score was 22.0, and the national average score was 21.1. In 2013, an Archbishop Bergan student scored a 36 on the ACT.

CLASS RANK

A class rank and the grade point average are computed on a 4.0 scale. Class rank is recalculated at the end of each term. Grade weighting is used only for College Biology, Calculus, Physics, & Spanish IV.

ADVANCED COURSES

Math students are accelerated to take calculus in their junior or senior year. College course work is common at Archbishop Bergan. Students have taken more than thirty-five separate college courses. Half of these courses have been taken on campus at Midland University and the other have been taken on the Bergan campus. These included correspondence courses as well as courses taught by on-site professors. All graduates in 2012 and 2013 had at least one college course.

SPECIAL CURRICULUM PROGRAMS

In addition to Advanced courses, Archbishop Bergan has a unique relationship with Midland University and Metro Community College. This allows Archbishop Bergan students to earn a great amount of college credit. A School-to-Career program allows students to apply their knowledge and skills in a variety of school and community volunteer settings.

Bergan's culture is to prepare students for college. A student earning 280 credits plus college courses is a normal occurrence.

Before graduation, every Bergan student must demonstrate, through a personal presentation, the integrated skills of speaking, the focused organization of information and the proper use of technology. Careers work begins in grades 9 and 10 and meets regularly in grades 11 and 12 to accumulate the equivalent of a one-semester course.

Theology is required of all students attending Archbishop Bergan Catholic School. Great respect is shown for the religious beliefs of people of other faiths who are asked to consult the course descriptions and administration for answers to questions.

SCHEDULE

The middle/high school day consists of eight forty-five minute periods. Most classes meet every day for one period.

Five credits are granted for passing each semester course. The year is divided into two eighteen-week semesters; each semester has two nine-week quarters.

Students are required to be in class every period unless excused for a valid reason such as attending a college course that meets on Monday, Wednesday & Friday.

SERVICE REQUIREMENT

Through the theology curriculum and coursework, high school students are required to complete 20 hours of service a school year. Upon graduation a student must have 80 hours of service documented and submitted.

HOUSE SYSTEM

The primary goal of the House System is to nurture caring relationships among students and encourage a sense of family through faith, knowledge, and service. It enables all students to embrace their potential for leadership while preparing them to make positive changes in the community.

Every Archbishop Bergan Catholic School student is assigned a mixed grade level group or House, each named for a Saint that the students would like to emulate. Each House has a specific color, motto, mascot, and banner that exemplifies what their House stands for. Students meet in their House weekly for various activities. Students also sit with their House at school mass. Through their House interactions students participate in faith sharing activities, mild competitions, service projects, and school activities that earn points for their house. At the end of the year, the House that accrues the most points is crowned the House Champion.



In June of 2013, the AdvancED organization on Accreditation and School Improvement recognized Archbishop Bergan Catholic School as a Kindergarten through Twelfth grade accredited school system. Archbishop Bergan Catholic School Is accredited through the Nebraska Department of Education as well.

Don't forget SCRIP

SCRIP may be purchased at the Parish Office and is available in various denominations for Hy-Vee, Wal-Mart, Food-4-Less, BP gas, Shell gas, Menards and Burger King, just to name a few.

Our SCRIP program is able to purchase the gift certificates at a discounted rate, and we sell them to you for full face value. The difference provides the revenue. The money raised by the SCRIP program pays for special projects for the school and provides tuition relief. The SCRIP program will

also allow the SCRIP purchaser to contribute tuition credit to the family of their choice when purchasing SCRIP.
