Alumni Strategy/Bergan Fund and Giving Days

Bergan Fund fiscal year ends June 30, 2024. Bergan Fund total is currently at \$319,000 with a fiscal year-end goal of \$400,000. Personal letters, calls, and asks will be made to those who have given in the past 5 years to the Bergan Fund, but have not given yet this fiscal year.

Nebraska Catholic Day of Giving for the Parish on May 1st was a success this year! We more than doubled our donors from previous years, having 245 total this year. We did meet the \$60k goal for this year raising \$60,703. The greatest success for this day was the May Day baskets! The baskets were a huge hit with the recipients and we did see the majority of recipients give during the day as well! AND #1 on the leaderboard for the Omaha Archdiocese!

Fremont Area Big Give on May 7th was a great day for the school! While we were just shy of the \$80k goal, we did raise \$79,000 and were #1 on the leaderboard. We doubled the number of donors over any other nonprofit, 220 donations were given in 24 hours, and had 36 self-identified new donors to the school.
